Al wat anders is as opsie 2 is dat daar nie n mandjie proses gaan wees nie. Elke persoon sit sy eie duiwe in sy eie mandjie. Dan is daar ook nie n amptelike uitsaan nie. Die "training print out" kan afgeneem word en deur gestuur word.

Wat Klubgelde aanbetref, kan elke klub afhangende van hul lopende uitgawes sy eie besluit neem hoeveel n lid moet betaal.

Sanpo gelde bly R130 wat bestaan uit R50 vir die provinsie. En R80 vir Sanpo.

Unie gelde is huidig R250 en is ook betaalbaar.

Dear VPU members

Just a little clarity following query.

If Option 1 ( Training Mode ) was selected. We are still going to follow the program in terms of 2 liberations from the same locality, Option 2 ( racing mode ) first, followed by option 1 ( training mode ) + - half an hour apart. Under option 1 all birds young and open will be liberated at the same time. This means everyone who require training baskets must indicate how many young pigeons and Open pigeons baskets they want.

Furthermore, each club will then work out a result for young pigeons and Open pigeons. These results will be loaded on the VPU website. A combine , young and open result will also be done. There just aren't going to be any official VPU championships.

All that is different from option 2 is that there will be no official basketing process. Each person puts his own pigeons in his own basket. Clocking is done on training mode , training mode print out can be sent through to the respective club's race secretary.

With regard to Club fees, each club can make its own decision, depending on their running expenses, how much a member has to pay.

Sanpo fees remain R130, consisting of R50 for the province. And R80 for Sanpo.

Union fees are currently R250 and are also payable.
